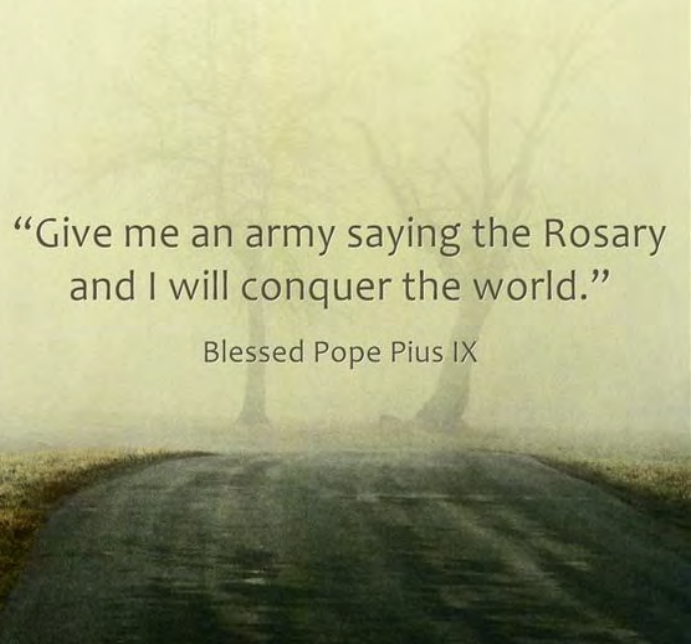

READING I — AM 6:1A, 4-7

Thus says the LORD the God of hosts: Woe to the complacent in Zion! Lying upon beds of ivory, stretched comfortably on their couches, they eat lambs taken from the flock, and calves from the stall! Improvising to the music of the harp, like David, they devise their own accompaniment. GOSPEL — LK 16:19-31

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. And lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who would gladly have eaten his fill of the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father

Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.' Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.' He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.' But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

Fr. Peter Samborski
associate pastor to
Transfiguration.**

Father Piotr Samborski was born on October 5, 1988, in Siedlce, Poland.

After graduating Bolesław Prus High School in Siedlce, he continued education at the John Paul II Mayor Seminary in Diocese of Siedlce.

After three years studying philosophy and theology, he came to the U.S. in 2010 to continue his priesthood vocation in Archdiocese of Chicago. His first year, Fr. Samborski spent on studying English at the University of Illinois-Chicago. Subsequently, he was admitted to the University of Saint Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary in Mundelein, Illinois.

He was ordained to the diaconate May 10th, 2014, by His Eminence Francis Cardinal George in the Seminary Chapel in Mundelein. He did his Clinical Pastoral Education at University of Washington Medical Center in Seattle, WA, during the summer of 2014. For his diaconate internship he was sent to St. John Brebeuf Parish in Nilens, IL, in February 2015.

On May 2, 2015, he received his Master of Divinity in Theology from University of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary. Fr. Samborski was ordained to the priesthood on May 16, 2015, by Cardinal Blase Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago at Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago.

Fr. Samborski began his first assignment July 1, 2015, at St. John Brebeuf as Associate Pastor. At St. John Brebeuf he is responsible for the Marriage Preparation Program and the Annulment Ministry. He is RCIA Director and chaplain to the Parish School.

In 2018, Fr. Samborski was asked by Tribunal of the Archdiocese of Chicago to be a Polish Field Delegate to cases for Declaration of Nullity of Polish couples. He also translates for the Archdiocesan Tribunal Polish cases of Declaration of Nullity. Since September 2018 he has been a member of Polish Council of the Archdiocese of Chicago, which is responsible for Polish Ministry in the Archdiocese.

In addition, Fr. Samborski is one of the Cardinal's Master of Ceremonies for the Liturgies and Masses with Cardinal Cupich.

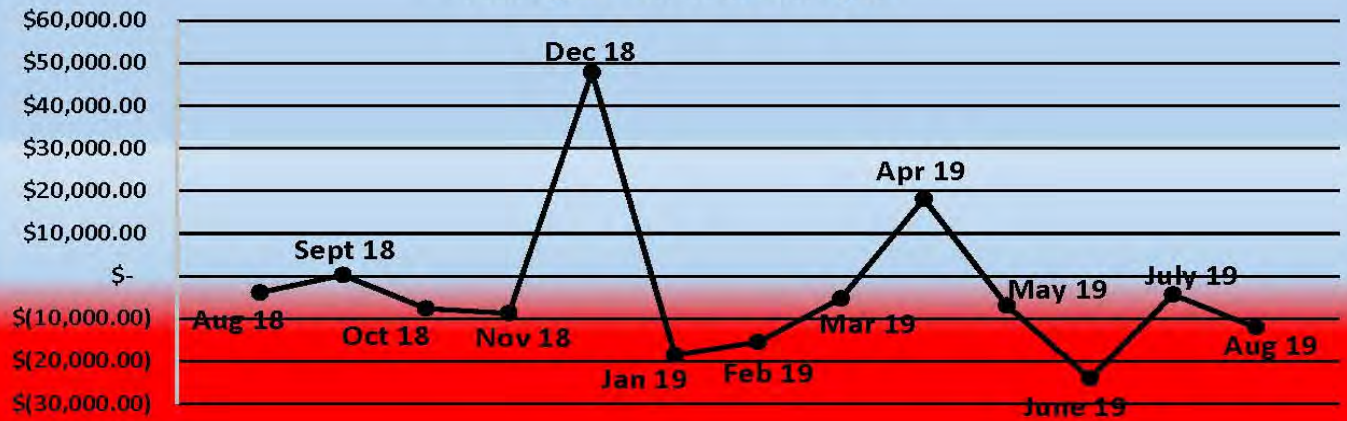

Ask, Ask, Ask, Ask, Ask

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus teaches his disciples how to pray; and when he does, he gives not only them but all of us the wonderful prayer we call ‘the Our Father’ or ‘the Lord’s prayer.’

The first thing to notice about the Lord’s prayer is that it is full of petitions. The first one is that God’s name would be hallowed. The second is that God’s kingdom would come. The third is that God would give us our daily bread. And so on.

The Lord’s prayer isn’t just a litany of praise to God, then. It isn’t just an expression of a pious wish that God’s will be done. It isn’t only a surrender of one’s own will to God. Just look at the request for daily bread. It presents to God what we would want God to give us. Having desires and presenting them to God are required by the Lord’s prayer.

The Lord’s prayer requires us to trust God enough to tell him what we want—over and over and over.

The second thing to notice about the Lord’s prayer is that people don’t generally get what they ask for. Ask and you will receive, the Lord says. But how many people around the world pray the Lord’s prayer and go without food that day? And food is only the beginning. In every mass, we ask God for healing: “Only say the word and my soul shall be healed.” Then we lug our sinful, sick, and sorrowful souls around another day.

So here is the third thing to notice. Jesus doesn’t promise that we will get the very thing we ask for. He says that if we ask, we will receive; but he doesn’t happen to mention what we will receive.

If you think about it, you can see the point. If a sick person could heal himself, he would be the doctor, not the patient. The patient’s job is to want to get well. It is the doctor’s job to figure out how to get him well.

In the same way, the Lord’s prayer requires us to trust God enough to tell him what we want—over and over and over. Our job is to ask continually. God’s job is to figure out what to give us that will really fill us and heal us.

So we might not get what we ask for. But as long as we keep asking, the Lord promises that we will receive—grace, pressed down, shaken together, running over, and gently given, from the God who loves us.

A Closer Look... at the Greeting in the Introductory Rite of the Mass

Did you know that every gathering at Mass not only joins with all the celebrations of Mass around the world but also with the angels and saints? It is one of the mysteries of our faith and a gift bestowing universal fellowship with all believers in Christ!

Today’s “Mass Moments” focus is on the greeting at the opening of the Mass.

After the priest, in the person of Jesus, has processed to the altar accompanied by our song of praise, he then stands in as our representative to lead us, the body of Christ, in prayer and praise to God our Father in this celebration of Mass. Our prayer begins with a reverent bow towards the altar by the priest and all the ministers of the Mass. While the ministers take their places around the altar or with the assembly, the priest comes around the Holy Altar and faces the assembly. His greeting is the first great call and response between Christ the head and the members of his mystical body, all of us here. The priest, now our representative to God the Father, first leads us in the Sign of the Cross. When we mark our bodies, not in our family names, but in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, the great sign of our Catholic faith, we are reminded that by our baptism, we are claimed by Jesus and we belong to Christ.

The Greeting ends with our priest offering each of us Peace in the name of Jesus. Our reply, ‘And with your Spirit’ is our response not just to the priest, but to Jesus Christ himself. This is much more than a simple (good afternoon/good morning)!

Next weeks’ “Mass Moments” insight will focus on the Penitential Rite, the opportunity for confession and forgiveness during Mass.

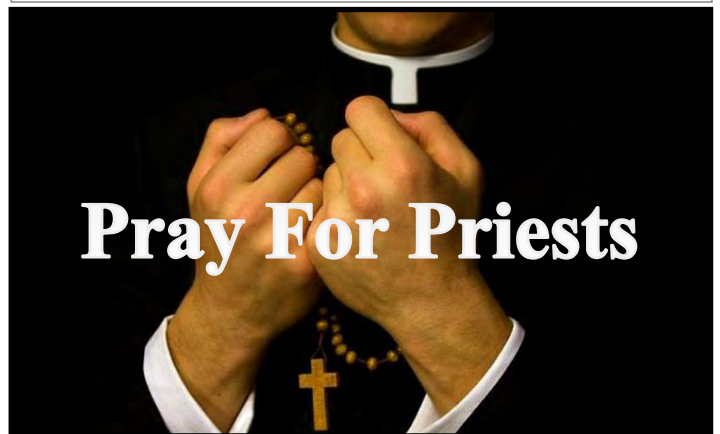

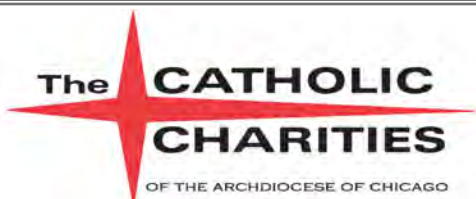
