

Mc 4, 26-34

One of the most controversial lines ever written belongs to the Apostle Paul, when he wrote: "Wives, be submissive to your husbands, as to the Lord" (Ephesians 5:22). Because of this teaching, Paul has been called a misogynist, a male-chauvinist, and worse.

They are the inspired Word of God, in which "everything asserted by the sacred author must be held to be asserted by the Holy Spirit" (Catechism of the Catholic Church #107). If this is true, then we must ask: What is God trying to teach us in Ephesians 5? What does it mean when the Holy Spirit inspires to Paul to teach that wives should be "submissive" to their husbands?

How the husband is an image of Christ, and the wife is an image of the Church.


